HOLIDAY SHOPPING CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

It is that time of year again. Thanksgiving is around the corner, and the Holiday shopping season is right behind it. Here are a few pointers to protect yourself and your family during the shopping season:

- Be aware of who is around you and what is going on around you.
- Shop with friends or family, because there is safety in numbers.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- Pay for purchases with a check, credit, or debit card.
- If possible, carry only your driver's license, personal checks, or necessary credit or debit cards.
- If you carry a purse, wear the strap across your body, or wear a fanny pack.
- Do not carry your wallet in your back pocket. Put it in your front pocket of your pants for safety.
- Be aware that predators look for the "high dollar" shopping bags with your purchases. When possible slip bags/purchases in a plain, nondescript bag.
- What purchases while eating in the mall food courts; bags can be easily switched or taken.
- Educate your children about what to do if they are lost and talk to them about "Stranger Danger."
- Don't overburden yourself with too many packages. Use a store's package pick-up.
- Have your car keys ready in hand before leaving the store or mall.
- If you do return to your vehicle to unload purchases, place them in the trunk of the vehicle.
- Try not to shop too late in the evening. Remember, fewer people are around at that time.

HOLIDAY CRIME PREVENTION TIPS WHEN YOU PARK YOUR CAR

The Holiday shopping season is a VERY popular time for thieves. They love the “target rich” environment that the local malls and shopping centers offer. This Holiday shopping season, remember these safety tips and you will protect yourself and all of the things you will buy your family and friends:

- Shop early and leave early to avoid evening darkness
- Park in a high visibility areas, and check for lighting in case you leave during hours of darkness.
- Do not park next to a vehicle with dark, tinted windows.
- Prior to arriving at the shopping center, lock all of your valuable in the trunk of your vehicle.
- Ask security to escort you to your vehicle if you feel uncomfortable.
- Walk briskly, confidently, and directly through the parking lot. Be cautious of people handing out flyers or asking questions in the parking lot.
- Watch for people who may be following you. This can occur inside as well as outside. If you suspect someone is following you, report it to security immediately.

These tips can be applied at any time during the year. Remember...**TAKE YOUR VALUABLE OUT OF YOUR CAR**, lock your doors and set your car alarm (if you have one). A minute or two of vigilance will save you hundred, if not thousands of dollars in lost property and damages.
